Despite the spread of COVID-19 in one part of the world, which has resulted in the cancellation of some exhibitors, or as a precaution or closure of borders, such as China, Italy, Canada, Brazil, and some U.S. companies, IADE Tunisia has kept its promises by bringing together more than 23 countries represented by exhibitors and 42 civilian and military delegations.

The volume of business and the signing of agreements were there. The number of visitors in the “official delegations”, “corporate executives” category is very significant.

This edition saw above all the establishment of visit programmes for all the Heads of Major States. For the 2022 edition, the organising committee will pay particular attention to the steering system of the official delegations in order to benefit the majority of the exhibitors from the pre-programmed visits.

INAUGURATION CEREMONY

Honored by the President of the Republic, Kaïs Saïed, the opening ceremony was held on Wednesday, March 4, in the presence of the Minister of National Defence, Mr Imad Hazgui, the Minister of Transport and Logistics Anouar Maarouf and other Tunisian and foreign civil and military figures.

The opening of IADE Tunisia was marked by the organization of a series of air shows performed with great professionalism by the Saudi Hawks, a Turkish F-16 patrol, as well as passages of the Tunisian Air Force.



- 348 pre-programmed B2B appointments.


General public

The main objective of these days was to encourage vocations in a rapidly growing sector in Tunisia and to broaden the range of potential interests.




Breakdown of visiting countries





Breakdown of professional visitors by socio-professional category





Visitor profile by industry



General appreciation of the show




At the end of the show, the exhibitors believe they have achieved their objectives
